TARGET(S)

- To develop an appreciation for personal family photographs.
- Find a family photograph that fits on the history of photography timeline.

DETAILS

- Discuss with your family (probably parents or grandparents) the existence of the oldest family photographs in your possession.
- If you have a scanner at home, scan the photograph and e-mail it to yourself and your instructor (might need to resize in order to make it less than 1mb).
- If you do not have a scanner at home, bring the photo to school, scan it, and take it immediately home. Make sure you put your family name on the photo in case it gets left in class – DO NOT write in pen directly on the back of the photo, use a small sticker that has your name written on it
- Journaling - There will be an InDesign template provided for you to insert your photo into. You will also need to find:
 - Who were the people in the photograph?
 - Where was the photograph taken?
 - When was the photograph made?
- The class will use these pages to add to our Photo Timeline in class to gain a perspective of your photos.
