Final Product

The final product will be a contact sheet and the digital files in a clearly marked folder. You must also label your contact sheet, and identify any great photos for the publications to consider.

Check For

- Did you sign up for the assignment?
- Do you have the proper equipment?

- Do you know what is expected of you?

You can (and should) complete this assignment early – plan ahead!

Photo Journalism requires quick decisions, preparation, anticipation of events, and creativity. In order to help develop these skills as a photographer, each student in Photography II will serve as a Photo Journalist for the ERHS publications.

You are required to take photographs at **FOUR** activities during this semester. You must be diverse in your choices of events. You will not be able to choose one type of event (eg: all sports photos). At this time you will be free to choose your events, though Mr. Meyerhoff may help choose some specific events. You should choose 1 sporting event, 1 club or school activity, and one other school event.

Your assignments must be potential photos for the ERHS publications, JagWire and Facets. All photos must be acceptable for publication in a school environment.

Club and activities

Assemblies

Class projects

Sporting events

Dances

Special events at ER

Other assignments that may be requested by the publications staffs

All students must sign-up for events in advance. When there are too many students for a particular event (eg: assembly), Mr. Meyerhoff reserves the right to assign students to that event based on experience, grade, and reliability.

Students will be evaluated on the proper completion of the assignment, creativity of photographs, and any potential photos suitable for publication.

There may be chances for multiple photographers to go together to an event with the instructor to work on their skills together.

Use your planner to look at 10 potential dates and events that you could take photos of.

Turn-in guidelines: Unless there are exceptional circumstances, the assignment should be turned in **NO LATER** than **TWO CLASS DAYS** after the event.
